





**WRITER/PERFORMER** 

Deb Filler has worked internationally Deb was also a contributing writer as an actor, writer and comic for the past 25 years.

**Deb studied theatre in New York** with Stella Adler, Uta Hagen and Deborah Hedwall. In her time as a performer. Deb has appeared with various theatre companies throughout the US, UK, Australia and New Zealand. Deb's first one-woman show was named Pick of the Fringe Festivals by the CBC, Canada.

Deb's last solo show, Punch Me In the Stomach, co-written with Alison Summers, has toured internationally for 11 years, winning Critics' Pick at the New Zealand International Festival of the Arts. Punch Me In the Stories from a South Pacific Jewish Stomach will have its UK premiere off West End, in London, in May 2004. The show has also been adapted by film director Francine Zuckerman into a feature film which is still screened on television internationally.

FILLER UP! had its World Premiere with a sell-out season in London in March 2003. Workshops of the show have sold out at the 2002 Edinburgh Festival and in Toronto, Baltimore, Winnipeg and several other cities.

Deb has worked on numerous productions as co-writer, and as a comic performer internationally. She is the voice of the Peg Bundy doll (from Married With Children) and 'Mummy' in the award winning animated series, Bob and Margaret. in Daughters of Absence, edited by Mindy Weisel.

Deb is a talented musician and has toured the US and the UK as a cabaret artist. She was lead singer in several rock and roll bands and founding member of The Ratz and Debbie and the Dum Dums, two celebrated New Zealand punk cabaret groups.

In the past three years Deb has been playwright-in-residence with several theatre companies. She is currently in the process of developing a new show as well as writing her first book, FILLER UP! Food on a Schtick - Recipes and Family. She is also writing a screenplay of FILLER UP!, a drama and a comedy.



Irina Brown has worked in theatre internationally for many years and has a long list of directing credits to number of revivals. She has also her name. 

# LIGHTING DESIGNER

Tim Mascall trained at the Merlin Theatre and then at the Strode Theatre in the UK.

Tim's recent lighting designs include Off the Wall 2002 for The David Glass Ensemble (UK tour) and Passion for the Marie Forbes **Dance Company at The Place** Theatre, London.

Tim's re-light credits include the number one National Tour of The Vagina Monologues; the Scottish **Dance Theatre / Dundee Rep** Theatre (UK and European tours): Plunge, She Is As He Eats, To Time Taking Blush, Interlock, Highland, Playfall, Cranes, Inside Somewhere; and The David Glass Ensemble Unheimlich Spine.

1 tsp. sugar 2 tsp. salt 1 cup warm water 2 eggs 1 envelope of yeast 4 - 5 cups flour (half bread, half cake) 1/4 cup oil poppy seeds 1 cup warm water 1 egg yolk beaten with pinch salt 1/3 cup sugar 1 tsp. water

Dissolve 1 tsp. sugar in 1 cup warm water in a large mixing bowl which has first been rinsed with hot stand for 10 minutes.

Stir to dissolve. Combine with oil, water, 1/3 cup sugar, salt, 2 eggs and half of flour. Beat well. Stir in remaining flour. Dough should be sticky. Cover dough and let rest for 10 minutes. Turn out onto a floured board and knead for 10 minutes, adding flour as needed. Round up in a greased bowl. Cover and let rise in a warm place until double in bulk, about 1-2 hours. Punch down, cover and let rise again until double, about 45 minutes.

Divide dough into three equal parts. Shape into strands. Place on a lightly greased baking sheet and water. Sprinkle yeast on top and let braid loosely. Fasten ends securely. Cover with a damp cloth and let rise until double.

CHALLAH RECIP

E

Brush with beaten egg yolk and sprinkle with seeds. Bake at 400°F (200°) for 30 minutes, until golden brown.

To store yeast dough, grease top well and cover with wax paper and then a damp cloth. Make sure cloth stays damp. Will keep five days in the fridge. Freezes well.
